About Pet Pride

Pet Pride of New York saves the lives of homeless cats in our community by providing sanctuary, medical care, and placement into permanent adoptive homes. We are a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization and a New York State Registered Shelter/Rescue, and we operate a no-kill cat sanctuary and adoption center in Victor, New York. Once a cat is admitted to Pet Pride, he or she stays with us for as long as it takes to find their new, forever home.

Surrendering a Cat

We know that making the decision to relinquish a pet can be very difficult. We're committed to working with you to try and bring about the best possible outcome for you and your cat.

We have to consider multiple factors in determining whether or not we can accept a cat into our sanctuary. Please understand that completion of the attached surrender profile and submission of veterinary records does not guarantee admission. In addition, there may be a lengthy waiting period prior to admission. Because we are a limited intake, no-kill facility, we cannot welcome new cats until we have found loving adoptive homes for ones we already have. We provide shelter and care for as many homeless cats as our space and resources allow, but we almost always have a waiting list.

Admissions Checklist

- Ask your veterinarian(s) to provide us with copies of all records for your cat so that we have a complete medical history. These may be mailed to the address above, faxed (585-742-1641), or emailed (ppny@wny.twcbc.com).
- Provide confirmation that your cat is up-to-date on all vaccines, including FVRCP and Rabies.
- Have your cat combo tested for FeLV/FIV within one month prior to admission.
- It is preferred that your cat have a complete veterinary exam within one month prior to admission.
- It is preferred that your cat be spayed or neutered prior to admission.
- Complete the attached surrender profile. This helps us get to know your cat and place them in a home best suited to their needs and temperament.

All information will be reviewed and taken into consideration. If your cat has had a recent veterinary examination and has been spayed or neutered and if all vaccines and testing are up to date, this may move you up the wait list.

A donation of \$100 is requested at the time of admission to offset the costs caring for your cat until a permanent adoptive home can be found.
